Once sponsored by the Container Store, this spectacular three-season Gateway Garden has been a prominent feature in the White Plains landscape for many years. 



#### **MICHAELIAN GAZEBO TURNING 40**







The Edwin G. Michaelian Gazebo in Tibbits Park will turn 40 years old this year.

The gazebo, dedicated Oct. 14, 1984, is named for a former White Plains mayor and Westchester County executive who was a music lover and an ardent supporter of White Plains Beautification Foundation. He died in 1983, as WPBF was raising money for the gazebo, and the organization decided that it would be a fitting tribute to memorialize him with the Victorian structure.

Building the gazebo was a true labor of love.

Architect Robert W. Pollack, a WPBF board member, designed it pro bono. Contractors and artisans donated their time and talent to build it. WPBF raised some \$40,000 - much of it through corporate sponsors and Ed's many friends - to fund it. Ed's widow, Joyce Michaelian, provided the copper rooster weathervane that symbolizes eternal vigilance (semper vigilans) and that caps the gazebo.

In a light-hearted look at the time spent in planning and building the eight-sided edifice, former WPBF President Barbara Vrooman explained: "Well... you see... in essence... a gazebo is... well..., it's a 'state of mind' as much as a physical reality. At least as much time must be devoted to quiet contemplation and sweet reflection as to the actual construction."

And the gazebo has a legacy.

Those who attended a fundraising breakfast at Pace University, organized by then-President Brian Wallach, provided the money for the construction. This became the core and impetus for WPBF's Adopt-a-Park Program, the vehicle that provides more than 65 gardens and other plantings on public spaces across White Plains.

#### THE BRIGHTS HONORED AT ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION

On a cool, yet sunny April 26, White Plains Beautification celebrated Arbor Day at Eastview School by honoring the many contributions to our community of Rebecca and Harry Bright who both passed away last year. A red maple tree was planted in their honor.

In the 60 years the Brights made White Plains their home, their impact was evidenced by those who came to honor them.

Westchester County Executive George Latimer and White Plains Mayor Thomas Roach presented proclamations from the


county and city. Attending were all six White Plains Common Council members; State Senator Shelley Mayer; State Assemblywoman Amy Paulin; County Legislator Ben Boykin; Matthew Paul, senior forester, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

WPBF Director Nick Wolff and others related personal stories about how the Brights had influenced their lives.

City Public Works Commissioner Stefania Mignone presented a flag indicating that White Plains has been a Tree City USA designee for 41 years. Other speakers included City Parks & Recreation Commissioner Wayne Bass, Eastview Principal Leroy Dixon and Schools Superintendent Dr. Joseph Ricca.

Nancy Giges, a Beautification Director and Arbor Day chair, opened the hour-long program and Beautification President Terry Hanson talked about the environmental significance of the red maple.

The Eastview Chorus, directed by Matt Hommez, sang "This Pretty Planet" and "Trees for America." Dana DeLorto's students created original pixelated Arbor Day art that was on display.

The maple tree was a gift to Beautification from the friends and relatives of the Brights. Mike McGowan, arborist at Bartlett Tree Service, supervised the planting pro bono and is providing follow-up care for the tree. Both Bartlett and Consolidated Edison provided red maple seedlings for attendees and students.

The efforts of Assistant Principal Suzanne Lasser, who was also instrumental in creating the event brochure, ensured the program ran smoothly. Blaine Levenson, also a Beautification Director, played an important role behind the scenes.

#### TRIBUTE TO THE BRIGHTS



Rebecca and Harry Orlo Bright Jr. were extraordinary, each in their own way, in giving back to the White Plains community.

Harry held many leadership positions throughout his life — in the U.S. Army and U.S. State Department, as a public school teacher, a marketing expert with a Fortune 500 company and, especially, as an advocate for human rights — earning the admiration and respect of all those around him.


He was the first African-American to serve on the White Plains Common Council. He served as president of the White Plains Rotary Club, president of the Association of Local Human Rights Agencies of New York State, was president and co-founder of the White Plains Coalition for Cultural and Racial Harmony, a board member of the White Plains YMCA, the Greater White Plains Council of Community Services, United Way of Westchester and Putnam Counties and more.

A stalwart supporter of her husband, Beckie's accomplishments were equally impressive. An accomplished musician, she toured Europe as a classical singer and became a much beloved music teacher at Eastview Middle School for more than 30 years. She influenced thousands of students by conveying that music education provides young people the opportunity to share the experience of working together to achieve a specific result, in addition to learning to sing and to appreciate the art of music.

She was a board member and ardent supporter of White Plains Beautification, and active with the White Plains Woman's Club and Chatterton Hill Church.

Beckie died in May 2023 at the age of 92 and, only a few months later, Harry left us, too, at the age of 94.

Together they made life better for anyone whose lives they touched.

#### IT'S A TIME OF THE SIGNS



One of the first new signs at the Rotary Garden in Tibbits Park.

Same design, stronger structure, larger faceplate. WPBF has begun to replace the Adopt-A-Park-sponsored signs with new legs and a new faceplate. The new leg posts are metal, replacing the wooden posts that tended to deteriorate over time and had to be replaced every three years. The metal posts will also be 4" taller and will be placed in gardens that will benefit from more height. The face plate is 4" longer, allowing for larger lettering of the sponsor's name. Older signs will be replaced as they wear out.
